

National Mayor's Challenge Continues; Wyland's Interactive Water Exhibit Visits Tucson



The Wyland Clean Water Mobile Learning Experience, a 1,000-square-foot interactive exhibit on wheels, comes to Tucson.

It's near the halfway mark and Tucson continues to hold on to its top spot in the National Mayor's Challenge for Water Conservation.

Residents are asked to "pledge for water" online at www.mywaterpledge.com.

Cities with the highest percentage of residents who take the April challenge are entered in drawings for hundreds of environmentally-friendly prizes, including a Toyota Prius *c*, water-saving fixtures and gift certificates to Lowe's stores.

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To celebrate Tucson's participation, the Wyland Clean Water Mobile Learning Experience, a 1,000-square-foot interactive exhibit on wheels solely dedicated to demonstrating the many ways water shapes our lives, visited the McCorkle Academy of Excellence.

The traveling exhibit features interactive models – from an onboard running river to a 40-person theater with computer-controlled special effects – to explore the nation's complex relationship with its water resources.



McCorkle students and their teachers toured the exhibit in groups. The school also hosted a brief assembly featuring Steve Creech, Wyland Vice President, and other invited guests. Wyland's PowerPoint presentation "A Challenge to Save Water" was shown.

Tucson Water helped arrange the visit which was one of the stops on Wyland's national tour to promote the Challenge.
